to, and rendered active service in the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militiaman, or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain." - Constitution of National Society S. A. R., Article III, Section 2, adopted June 3, 1907, and so amended.

Membership is based upon one original chain; when the applicant desires eligibility by descent from more than one Revolutionary ancestor, and it is desired to file additional chains, separate applications on special forms must be made in each case and filed with the original. State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the re-ancestor, with dates of birth and death, if known. By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

Gaddis' Company Virginia Militia born in Washington County Va. in 1747 and died in 1815 in Loudoun County Va. Married Hannah Steer in 1775. Hannah Steer was born in 1751.
